Shipwrecks, weird rock formations, hidden caves, historic lighthouses – if all of this sounds exciting to you, head over to Tobermory, a quaint harbour village located in the northern tip of the picturesque Bruce Peninsula in Ontario.

Taking a boat trip is the best way to admire the sheer awesome beauty of the shoreline of Tobermory and the pristine wilderness of Fathom Five National Marine Park, Canada's first national marine park. You may get a glimpse of the many waterfowls from the deck. What's more, lying in the turquoise blue waters are some real shipwrecks for you to explore. The boat will also take you to Flowerpot Island, which is the only island in the marine park where hiking is permitted. Learn about how the forces of nature have created the two majestic rock formations that resemble massive flowerpots, for which the island is named, and how some sea caves end up high in the cliffs. Don't forget to visit the historic lighthouse on the island that has been guiding ships for over a century.

Cruises between Little Tub Harbour and Flowerpot Island only run from May to October, so don't miss your chance to explore the unique charm and beauty of Tobermory, both above and below the crystal clear waters, for a fabulous summer day.
